PUBLIC ART: IT'S LIKE HAVING A GALLERY, RIGHT IN YOUR OWN BACKYARD

Dublin's Public Art Ordinance calls for large private developers to set aside up to a half percentage of the project's construction value to install public art on their properties, or support the City's Public Art Fund.

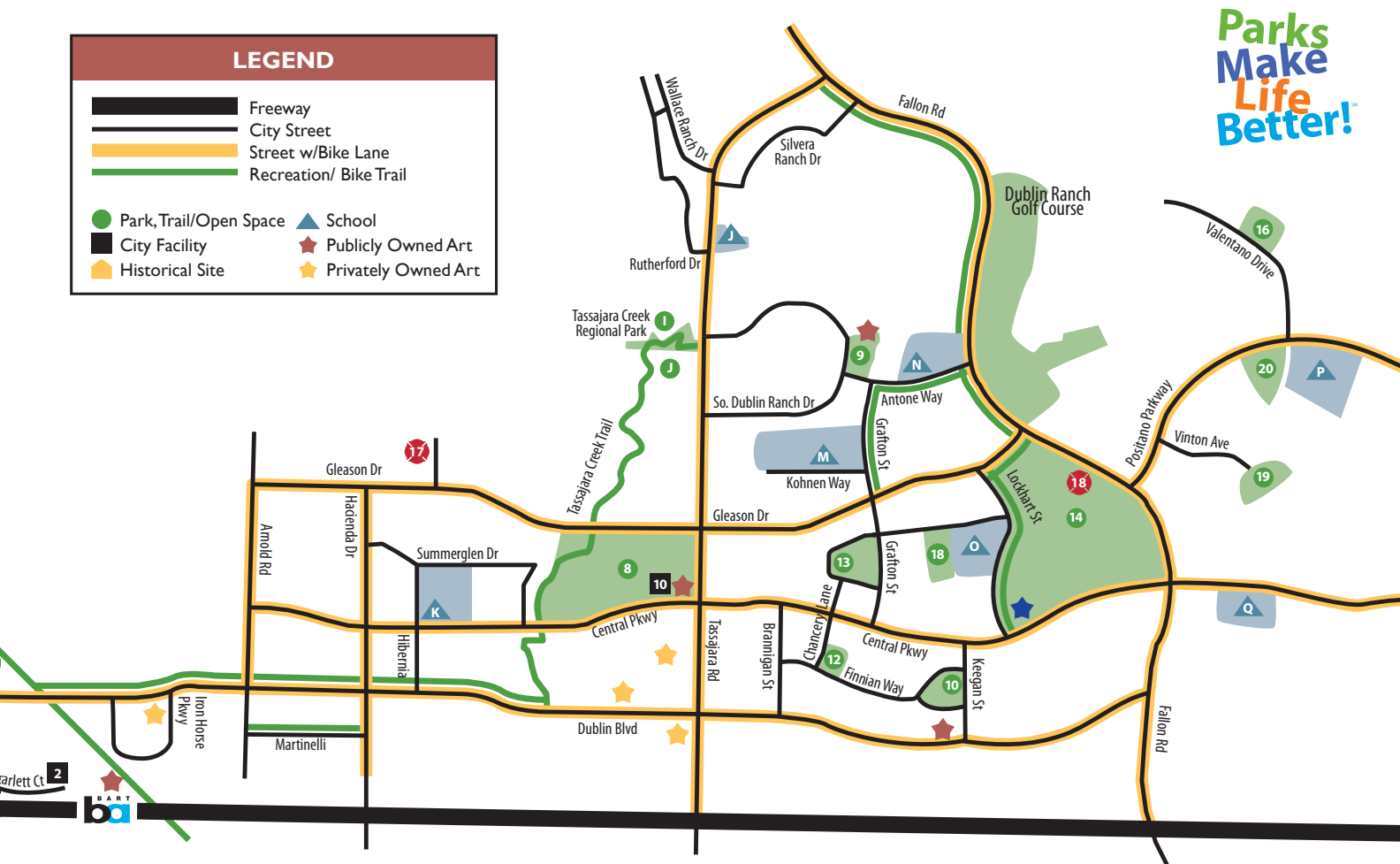
Look for this public artwork next time you are out and about in Dublin.

Towering 31 feet above Fallon Sports Park's Field Four, this abstract sculpture is inspired by the athletic human form in full extension, suggesting a baseball catcher leaping to catch a fly ball, a soccer goalie defending against a high kick, or a tennis player at the height of a serve. Its mirror-polished stainless steel surface reflects the sky and provides stunning views at sunset. Artist Heath Satow lives in Ogden, Utah. His public art sculptures can be seen throughout the U.S. and as far away as Korea.
